





- Reached out and met with hundred's of families to ask them what they cared about

Studied opportunities created by Affordable Care Act (ACA)


3 Elements of Affordable Care Act (ACA)

- A multi-city organizing campaign to build community support for transforming how local health care systems are organized
- Use the tools and resources of the Affordable Care Act to improve access, quality and affordability of health care in local communities
- Address the public health conditions and social determinants of health that cause inequities in life expectancy and quality of life by race, income and geography

Research Data and Collaboration

- Residents researched the problem
- Formed Strategic Partnership with Dr. Jeff Brenner
- Collected Data
- Examined through system lens as well as what is unique to Camden

Long-term Federal Debt




Camden Health Data

- 2002 2009 with Lourdes, Cooper, Virtua data
 - 480,000 records with 98,000 patients
 - 50 % population use ER/hospital in one year
- Leading hospital utilizers citywide
 - 324 visits in 5 years
 - 113 visits in 1 year
- Total revenue to hospitals for Camden residents \$460,000,000 + charity care
 - Most expensive patient \$3.5 million
 - -30% costs = 1% patients
 - -80% costs = 13% patients
 - -90% costs = 20% patients




Percent of Population 30+ with Diabetes



Prevalence of Diabetes by Age




Diabetes Visits by Hospital




