1. Clearly defined match/cost sharing
2. Encouraged match/cost sharing
3. No mention of match/cost sharing



CLEARLY DEFINED MATCH

Chip-Match requirement 35%/65%

Lessons Learned

- a. Be clear about your intent, including:
 - Timeline for commitment with exit strategy
 - Your role: reports, seat on boards/com., branding
 - Going it alone or with partners
- b. Pressure to continue match



ENCOURAGED MATCH

Sustainable Communities Initiative (HUD)

“Although matching or cost sharing may not be required, HUD programs often encourage applicants to leverage grant funds with other funding to receive higher rating points.”

State Oral Disease Prevention Program (CDC)

“Cost sharing or matching funds are not required for this program. Although there is no statutory match requirement..., leveraging other resources and related ongoing efforts to promote sustainability is strongly encouraged.”



NO MATCH

Outreach and Enrollment Grants (CDC)

“Awardees, including states, are not required to provide a matching contribution. However, any outside funding that will be contributed to this effort by other entities should be mentioned in the Budget Narrative”

Cooperative Agreement to Support Navigators...(CMS)

“Cost sharing or matching is not required as a condition of award.”
