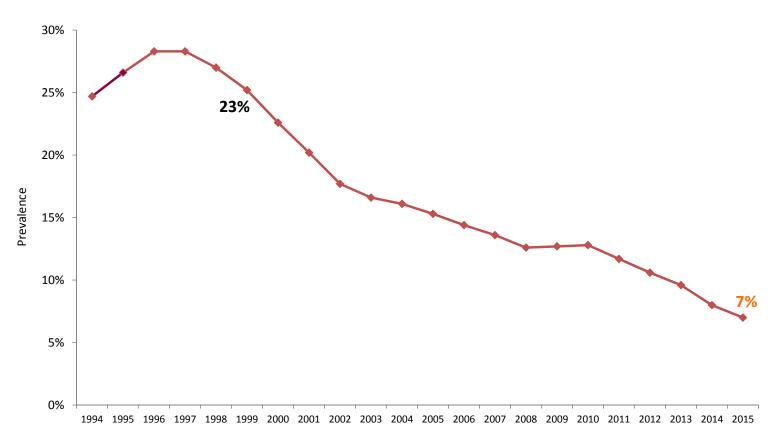

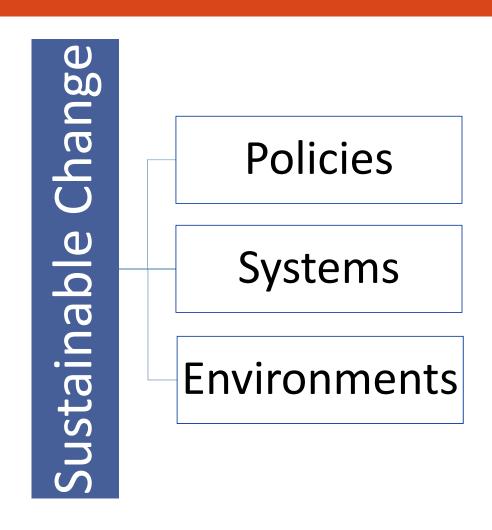

Return on Investment (For 2015)

37 instances of systems, environmental or policy change occurred impacting more than 1.5 million people.



- Annual Organizational budget of approximately \$800k
- 5 Adult Staff, 15 Youth Staff

For every \$1 invested in YES!, approximately 2 people's lives are positively impacted.
