History

- Launched in 1999 in partnership with The California Endowment
- Primary focus until recently has been clinics and health centers
- Most recently, with the launch of our Networking for Community Health program and the Health Home Innovation Fund, we have broadened our universe of grantees to include other CBO's and Safety net providers

Health Home Innovation Fund Creation

- In 2008 we launched our Networking program after extensive work with a leadership team of clinics and health centers in CA.
 - When asked what they would do with a down payment on the future – they said they would go back to the roots of clinics.
 - With significant funding we supported projects to support clinics to connect with community partners to organize and partner to solve community health issues

NCH Grantees

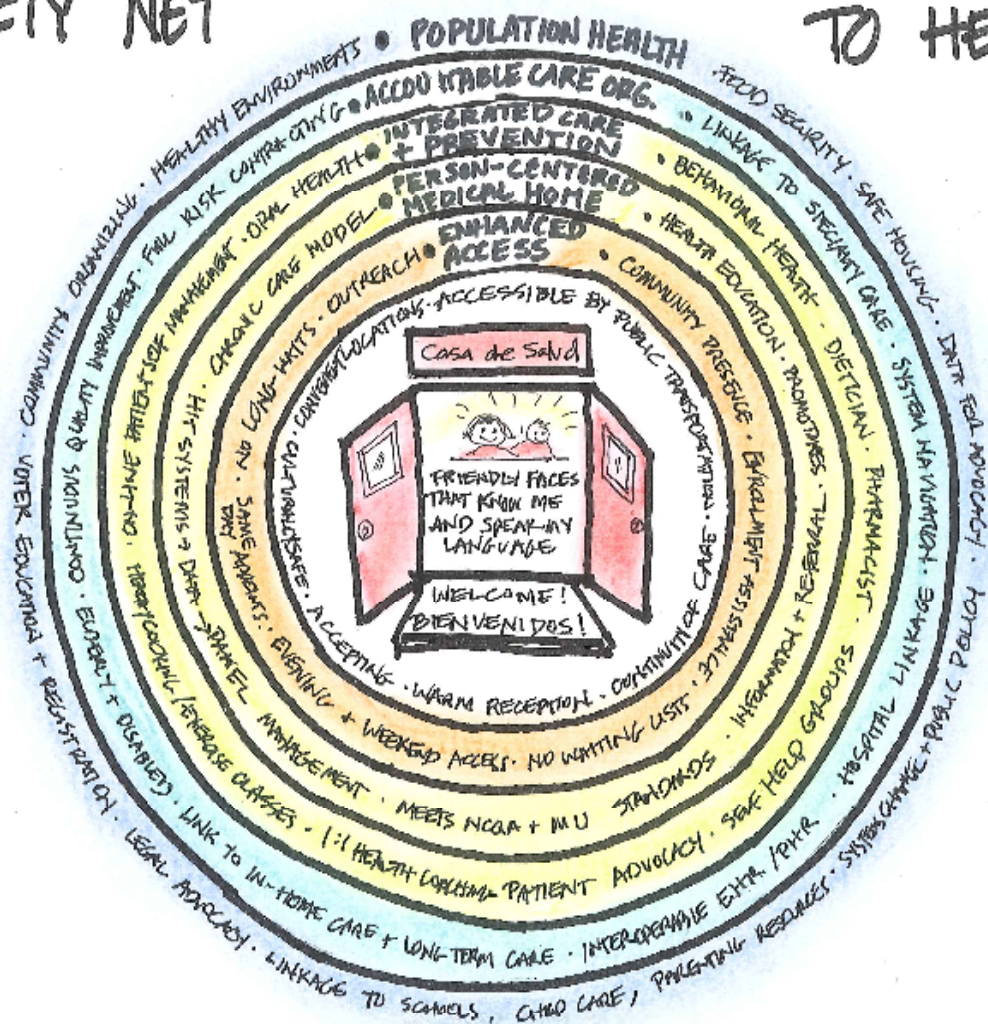
- Patient Navigator programs
- Beyond the Raised Bed - programs for food justice and access
- Safe Spaces - Safe spaces to walk, to take children and to shop
- Community Action - organizing for a cross walk across a busy intersection between a neighborhood and a farmers market
- Fresh water access
- Youth engagement and empowerment - not doing “for” young people, asking them to lead the way
- Integrated Behavioral Health Programs - including mental health and substance use access

Health Reform Passage and the Health Home

- In 2010, we launched an extensive research project and talked with stakeholders across the country about the patient centered medical home
- We studied the work of many of our colleagues (Commonwealth, RWJF and Colorado in particular)
- From that work, we crafted this graphic to guide our work

Health Home Innovation Fund

- Launched in 2011
- 2 main goals
 - Fund a small number of demonstrations of a fully integrated Health Home
 - Address some of the key payment reform issues that are barriers to implementation
- Grantees include: local health plans, clinics, public hospitals, behavioral health providers and other safety net supports
- \$500,000 over 2 years
