- The <u>Health Reform Monitoring Survey</u> (HRMS) Web site includes instruments (in addition to answers to frequently asked questions and links to briefs, data tables, and more).
- The <u>Kaiser Health Tracking Poll</u> is the Foundation's signature survey project, providing consistent and up-to-date information on the public's opinions, knowledge, and experiences with the U.S. health care system. Since the passage of the ACA, the Kaiser Health Tracking Poll has been a primary tool for monitoring all aspects of public opinion on the ACA, including overall favorability on the law, opinion on a wide variety of its provisions, public familiarity with what is (and is not) in the law, early experiences, and awareness and views of state-level decisions about implementation.
- <u>California's Uninsured on the Eve of ACA Open Enrollment</u>: This Kaiser Family Foundation report presents the findings of a baseline survey of California's uninsured adult population just before the start of the first open enrollment period under the ACA. It will be followed by three other surveys over the course of the next two years that will capture the changing experiences and attitudes of this same group of 2,000 people over time, whether they obtain coverage or remain uninsured.
- <u>The Uninsured at the Starting Line: Findings from the 2013 Kaiser Survey of Low-Income Americans</u> and the ACA: This report, based on the baseline 2013 Kaiser Survey of Low-Income Americans and the ACA, provides a snapshot of health insurance coverage, health care use and barriers to care, and financial security among insured and uninsured adults across the income spectrum at the starting line of ACA implementation. The report also examines how findings from the baseline survey can help policymakers understand and address early challenges in implementing health reform.
- <u>The Uninsured at the Starting Line in California: California findings from the 2013 Kaiser Survey of Low-Income Americans and the ACA</u>: This report, based on findings from the 2013 Kaiser Survey of Low-Income Americans and the ACA, provides a snapshot of health insurance coverage, health care use and barriers to care, and financial security among insured and uninsured California adults across the income spectrum at the starting line of ACA implementation.
- The <u>Kentucky Health Issues Poll</u> has been conducted annually since 2008 to assess what Kentuckians think about a variety of health topics affecting the Commonwealth, funded by the Foundation for a Healthy Kentucky.
- <u>Risk-Based Managed Care in Kentucky: A Second Year Implementation Report and Assessment of</u> <u>Beneficiary Perceptions</u>: This is the second in a series of reports to be produced by the Urban Institute as part of a three-year study funded by the Foundation for a Healthy Kentucky under their <u>Promoting Responsive Health Policy</u> initiative.
- <u>2012 Massachusetts Health Reform Survey</u>: This collection of reports and chart packs is the latest in a series by the Urban Institute analyzing the results of the Massachusetts Health Reform Survey (MHRS), which has been conducted since 2006. This round of the survey, which was fielded in the fall of 2012, was jointly funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts Foundation.
