

Upcoming ACA Surveys: Timeline

April	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>McKinsey's April survey</u> (Internet, panel-based longitudinal survey of 18-64 year old, non-Medicaid eligible, with 1000 respondents) has expanded questions to examine purchasing behavior (e.g. factors driving consumers to purchase insurance and driving those who have yet to engage in the market). • <u>Commonwealth Fund ACA Tracking Survey</u> is in the field. • The second wave of the <u>Kaiser California Panel Survey</u> second wave is in the field. • <u>Gallup</u> and <u>Urban</u> are currently fielding questions on the willingness of consumers to pay penalties at the \$95, \$100, and \$1000 levels. • The <u>Kaiser Health Tracking Survey</u> is being fielded and includes more questions on the residual unemployed. • Several <u>non-RAND partners</u> are doing hypothetical choice experiments based on type and price of insurance. • The <u>National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS)</u> is currently testing questions to improve accuracy on the <u>source and type of insurance coverage</u> that consumers have purchased. • The Kaiser Family Foundation expects to field a <u>survey of assistor programs</u> in April to capture how many people were helped, how things went, the common problems for which people requested assistance, identified barriers, and where people could have used more support.
May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gallup will officially release the <u>April enrollment and insurance coverage data</u> approximately on May 4th, 2014.
June	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RWJ-Urban Collaboration with 10 State Case Studies and Data. Quarterly with results 3 weeks later. • <u>Commonwealth Fund ACA Tracking Survey</u> will be released. They expect to deliver an estimated percentage uninsured rate for this quarter by comparing their results to those of the 3rd quarter of 2013. Data will include knowledge of subsidies, consumer estimates of eligibility for subsidies, and other message testing. • <u>Commonwealth Biennial Health Insurance Survey</u> will be fielded June-September 2014 and will include questions on past and current insurance status for a sample size of 4000-6000.

September	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RWJ-Urban Collaboration with 10 State Case Studies and Data. Quarterly with results 3 weeks later.

December	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RWJ-Urban Collaboration with 10 State Case Studies and Data. Quarterly with results 3 weeks later. • The <u>Kaiser Survey of Low-Income Americans and the ACA</u> will be re-fielded late in the 2014 calendar year (date still to be decided) and then compared with

	the baseline conducted prior to Open Enrollment.
Other	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The <u>MEPS Insurance Coverage</u> data from 2013 will be released in several months as a baseline for future insurance coverage research.• RAND will release all <u>American Life Panel</u> data at some point in 2014 with a six-month lag.• Kaiser plans to release a report on examining the <u>length of coverage for those in the non-group model</u> for an extended period of time versus the newly enrolled.• The Robertwood Johnson Foundation will <u>focus on consumer research</u> in 2014 to gain more information of consumer knowledge of subsidies, the ACA provisions, their personal subsidy eligibility, and other message-testing.
