

School-based Health Care Sustainability

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1970s: SBHC Movement Started

- Adolescents largely were uninsured and had limited access to care
- Increasing rates of teen pregnancy
- SBHCs as access points for reproductive and preventative services



1990s: Number of SBHCs Tripled
