

Supporting Ideas & Innovations To Improve Health Care For All Californians

- Private, nonprofit foundation, created when Blue Cross of CA converted from nonprofit to for-profit
- In operation since 1996, offices in Oakland and Sacramento with staff of 52
- Approximately \$40 million per year in projects and grants, primarily in four areas:
  - Better Chronic Disease Care
  - Innovations for the Underserved
  - Market & Policy Monitor
  - Health Reform & Public Programs Initiative

## Advancing HITECH in CA

#### Supporting Medi-Cal EHR Incentive Program

- Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act provided financial incentives to eligible providers and hospitals for adoption and meaningful use of electronic health records (EHRs)
- Additional federal funds available to state Medicaid agencies to support Medicaid EHR incentive program at 90:10 match rate :
  - Design and planning
  - Administration
  - Implementation

## Advancing HITECH in CA

#### Funding Impact and Next Steps

- Initial funding (\$400K) enabled CA to draw down \$3.6M in federal funds for program planning and administration
- As of February 2013, over \$487M incentive payments have been paid to 7,000 providers and 200 hospitals
- Fiscal impact on CA's General Fund estimated to be \$103.5M in additional revenue by June 2021
- CHCF funding shifting from core support to program enhancement:
  - Health information exchange
  - Quality improvement
